Fort McMurray Airport Awards Contract to Ledcor Construction Ltd.

The Fort McMurray Airport Authority (FMAA) has awarded the contract for the Air Terminal Building as part of the Airport Expansion and Redevelopment Project to Ledcor Construction Limited. The \$78 Million contract is the second major construction contract for the Airport Authority since it took over management of the airport from the Airport Commission in January 2010 and unveiled its new Development Plan in April 2010. It follows the award of the \$49 Million Site Works Contract to E Construction in May 2011. This contract is for the construction of a new 15,000 square meter three-level Air Terminal Building.

Scott Clements, President & CEO of the Fort McMurray Airport Authority stated “The award of the Construction Contract for the new Air Terminal Building represents another significant milestone for the Airport Expansion and Redevelopment Project and demonstrates the airport’s commitment to improve the facilities for Fort McMurray residents and the traveling public. The new Air Terminal Building will serve as a gateway to connect the World to the people, resources and opportunities in the Wood Buffalo Region. It is a huge step forward to achieving our vision of being Canada’s Premier Regional Airport”.

Bob Walker, Vice President, Northern Alberta - Ledcor Construction was extremely pleased with the award of this contract. “This is a very important project for Ledcor Group. We are excited to be part of the team that is transforming the gateway experience for the residents and visitors to the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo. We plan to draw on both our Alberta construction experience and extensive aviation experience to maximize the value we bring to the project and the Airport Authority.”

There is current planning to have construction of the Air Terminal Building to be inaugurated by Premier Ed Stelmach with an official ground breaking ceremony on August 29, 2011. The new Air Terminal Building is scheduled to open April 2014.
